Transportation.

The Bluff line, on which we based our former notice, having failed to complete their road to the Assembly grounds, we have chartered the Steamer *City of Alma* to run twice each day, except Sunday, between Alton and the grounds.

It will leave the grounds every morning and evening, connecting with all trains coming into and going out of Alton. Also, with the Steamer *Spread Eagle*, which leaves St. Louis every day, except Sunday, at 3 p.m. and returns leaving Alton every morning at 7 a.m.

The Steamer *City of Alma* will be under our own control. We can therefore, assure any one who wishes to attend the Assembly, that if they observe strictly our notice, they will find everything satisfactory.

Purchase round-trip tickets to Alton either by Railroad or Steamer *Spread Eagle*. Here you will find our boat waiting to take you to the grounds. Our boat will not stop anywhere for freight, and will get you to the grounds in time for services.
