TRANSPORTATION

Will be far superior to that of any former year. The "Bluff Line" from St. Louis to the Assembly Ground is complete, and will run *three* trains daily, way—morning noon and night—making the round-trip fare between points named at 40 cents, good during Assembly. Children 20 cents.

The Big Four will sell round trip tickets from all stations from July 17 to Aug. 17 at a fare and a third.

Excursions will be run as follows:

1st.—Saturday, July 23, to hear the Jennie Jackson Jubilee Singers, and all who will remain over until Monday, and take in Dr. Fry Memorial Day, July 24. Remember that tickets on Big 4 from St. Louis to the grounds on Saturday, good to return Monday are only \$1.35 round trip.

2d.—Aug. 6th.

3d.—Aug. 10th. Grand rally of Y. P. S. C. E. and Epworth League. Persons coming on Aug. 10 will remain over for Recognition Day, Aug. 11th.

4th.—Grand Music Day, Aug. 16th. See programme for each excursion that will occur.

From St. Louis and East St. Louis the C. & A. sells every day round-trip tickets to Piassa Bluffs and return at rates which are only a few cents more than one and one-third fare. These round trip tickets are good to return ten days after date of sale. From St. Louis to East St. Louis the C. & A. also sells excursion tickets every Saturday at one fare for round trip. These tickets good returning on Monday following date of sale. Then again for *Four Special Excursion Days*, viz: July 23d, Aug. 6th, 10th and 16th, the C. & A. also sell excursion tickets from St. Louis and East St. Louis at one fare for round trip tickets good returning day after date of sale.

From Jacksonville, Springfield and all stations south thereof the C. & A. will sell excursion tickets for the four special excursions, dates above named, at low rates which will not exceed one fare and a third for round trip.

PIASSA BLUFFS SPECIAL.

For the convenience of St. Louis people a special train is now running and will continue to run until the close of the Assembly, direct to the Assembly Grounds without change of cars, leaving Union Depot at 5:05 P. M., arriving at Assembly 7 P. M.; returning, leaves Assembly 7:10 A. M., arriving at St. Louis 9 A. M. Round-trip tickets can be secured on Saturday, good until Monday, for \$1.35, which is one fare for the round trip; also for the four excursion days, the rates will be one fare for round trip; other days for one and one-third fare.

Persons availing themselves of this arrangement will have the benefit of Saturday night, all day Sunday services at the Assembly and return to St. Louis on Monday morning in time for business.
